Safe Handling of Large Animals in Enclosed Spaces

Key Safety Points:

- **Maintain Proper Ventilation:** Ensure that the enclosed space has adequate ventilation to keep both animals and workers comfortable and reduce the risk of stress-related behavior.
- **Escape Routes:** Ensure that animals are given enough space to move and that workers can exit the enclosed area quickly in case of an emergency.
