Why It Matters:

- When possible, move over to allow vehicles to pass safely.
- Know Wisconsin laws on farm equipment on roadways, including lighting requirements.

Real-Life Risks:

- Many farm vehicle accidents happen at dusk when visibility is lower.
- Speeding motorists often misjudge how fast they are approaching slow-moving farm machinery.
